Chapman University's Early Years in Orange

Rand Boyd is a native Orange Countian, having grown up in Buena Park. In addition to his work at Chapman, he is the Archivist for CARL (California Academic and Research Libraries). Boyd worked as a library assistant at Southern California College of Optometry in Fullerton before joining the Leatherby Libraries staff in October 2007. Prior to his library career, he spent 20 years with the facilities division of the Disneyland Resort in a wide variety of jobs that included everything from restoring antique arcade games and orchestrions [a machine that plays music and is designed to sound like an orchestra or band] to planning restaurant rehabs. He holds a B.A. in U.S. History, a B.S. in Business System Analysis and a Master's Degree in Library and Information Science.

ur March program will feature the history of Chapman College's early years in Orange. Chapman University is celebrating 150 years of operation this year and has been in Orange almost 60 years. Rand Boyd, Special Collections & Archives Librarian at Chapman University, will be the speaker, and is especially well-qualified, having just completed a history of Chapman.

After World War II, as Chapman's student population increased, the college began looking for additional space. When the Orange Unified School District announced plans to build a new high school, Chapman purchased the old Orange Union High School campus located at Glassell and Palm, the current location of the university. Chapman moved from Los Angeles to the city of Orange in 1954, becoming the first accredited four-year college in Orange County. The five neoclassical style high school buildings have been preserved, renovated and earth-quake retrofitted; they are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

an's family has been in Orange since the late 1800's. His immediate family moved to Orange during the Great Depression and settled into a modest home at 227 S. Cambridge (unfortunately, torn down in the early 1960's). Although his father, uncle and brother all attended Orange High, Dan was in the second graduating class at Orange Lutheran. After high school, Dan received a business degree from Cal State Fullerton and embarked on his real estate career. His business, Orange Realty (established by Charlie Miles in 1949 and purchased by his father, a long time Orange realtor, in 1971) is the oldest operating real estate office in Orange. Dan started working there when he was 12 – emptying waste baskets and mowing the lawn).

Among many community activities, Dan served 2 terms on the Orange City Council, as President of the Orange Chamber of Commerce and as President of the Old Towne Preservation Association. Dan lives in a 1923 bungalow he restored at 278 N. Pine Street in Old Towne. Some of Dan's other interests include gardening, traveling and planting street trees throughout Orange



as the head of "Orange for Trees," a non profit he established in 1993 as an extension of his Leadership Orange class project. In his "free time," Dan can be found at the 24 Hour Fitness Center on East Chapman.

Dan is glad the Orange Historical Society exists to help preserve the rich history of Orange and he's excited about serving on the board of directors.
